Environmental sustainability

Our foremost support is given to national parks, and our tours are planned accordingly.

Private reserves are supported to the extent that they meet the following criteria:

- (1) The environment provided is as near as possible to natural habitat and territorial ranges; and
- (2) Interaction with wildlife is strictly limited to that which is necessary

We are opposed to the keeping of big cats in captivity, for the stated purposes of 'conservation'.

We DO NOT SUPPORT any project that allows big cat and human interaction.
